

# Agency 32 - Board Of Educational Lands & Funds

## Statutory Authority:

The Board of Educational Lands and Funds has elected not to submit a budget request so all the following request information applies only to the State Surveyor Office, which constitutes a division within Agency 32.

Nebraska Revised Statutes §84-401 through §84-415 inclusive.

## Vision Statement:

The State Surveyors Office added new services for Geographic Informations Systems (GIS) support in the previous biennium. As Geographic Information Systems (GIS) become prevalent the need for assistance in geo-referencing is increasing dramatically. As the cadastral office for the State of Nebraska we are the only logical source of assistance in surveying, geodesy, and geo-referencing. The demand for these services will quickly exhaust the resources of the Office unless we can find new ways to meet these demands with limited resources. The Office has relied heavily on digital technology to improve its operations and will continue this trend into the foreseeable future.

## Mission Statement:

The missions are directly related to the underlying principle that the division is the authority for cadastral, geodesy and geo-referencing for the State of Nebraska. The division intends to maintain its leadership in surveying by continually investing in training and educational opportunities for its staff. Most of the goals of the Division are consultant in nature and require a firm knowledge and understanding of current technology to be effective. This same knowledge can be applied to service based goals to make them more cost effective.

## Goals:

The goals of the division are quite simple in nature. Some of the missions are operational in nature with well-defined objectives. In these cases we will maintain adequate gauges to assure that the tasks are accomplished. On other missions the objectives are not as well defined. In these cases the division must respond and provide assistance. In support for surveyors the clients are well aware of the services provided and the goal is to meet their expectations. In support for GIS the clients, in most cases, are not yet aware of the services available. In this case we must develop methods to reach these clients even in cases where their operations are not known to us. We must develop new methodology, which applies our expertise in geo-referencing to their needs. Finally we must develop methods of delivering this knowledge to them in an expeditious manner.

## Agency 32 - Board Of Educational Lands & Funds Program 529 - Land Surveys

### Program Objectives:

1. Take charge of the field notes, maps, charts, and records of the US surveys.
2. Provide technical assistance, support, and advice to the various counties, cities, and other governmental bodies in NE in their endeavors to produce and maintain cadastral or other geo-referenced maps.
3. Prepare and issue, under the authority and direction of the board, a circular of instructions to the county surveyors of the state.
4. Establish and maintain a survey record repository.
5. Maintain, operate and provide data from three global positioning base stations for the use of the general public.
6. Maintain the abstract of trust lands controlled by BELF.
7. Provide legal descriptions for land sales by BELF.
8. Perform such other duties as the Board may require.

### Performance Measures:

**Inputs:** The input necessary to achieve objectives are often difficult to quantify because the division operates with a small staff, 5-6 FTE, and each person is required to perform duties in several of the objectives. To that end the only quantifiable input is the total FTE of the division which has remained constant.

**Efficiency:** The efficiency of the division has been forced to increase because BELF began selling trust property in FY97-98 which requires development of legal descriptions and approval of the deed documents. We have been able to provide this service without additional funding.

**Outcomes:** The division has been able to maintain most of the required objectives. Objective 3, issue instructions to county surveyors, has not been fully addressed.

**Quality:** Quality control is achieved by interaction with the clients. The division maintains an active role in professional organizations and other contacts with our clients to assure quality.
